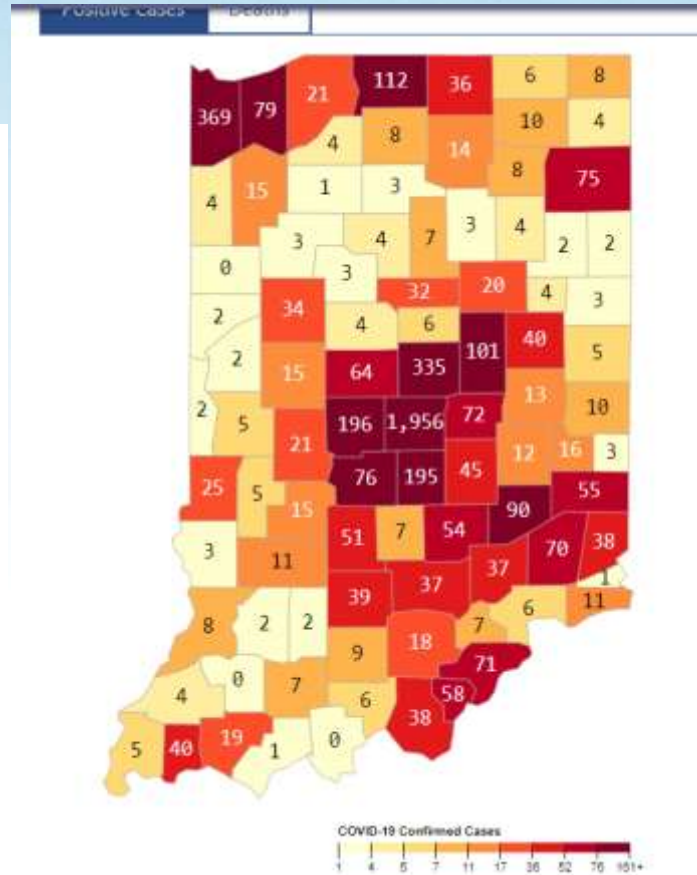
### Kentucky Coronavirus Monitoring
